MAYWEATHER CONVICTED OVER FIGHT WITH WOMEN

World lightweight boxing champion Floyd Mayweather Jn: has been convicted of misdemeanour battery stemmin from a fight with two women inside a Las Vegas nightclub. Mayweather received a suspend sentence of one-year in jail and was ordered to undergo counselling. Justice of the Peace Deborah Lippis said if Mayweath didn't complete "impulse controcounselling and stay out of trout for a year, he would spend a year in prison. He was also ordered to pay a US\$1,000 fine or do 1,000 hours of community service. AP
